Dear Madame Minister.

Please do not abandon Cambodian democratic and human rights development journey.

Swedish diplomatic ties with Cambodia began in 1961. Since the opening of the embassy in Phnom Penh in 2010, the Swedish government has with their multi-dimensional development approach, contributed significantly to advancing Cambodia's democratic governance and rule of law. This was a necessary pre-condition to assist the Cambodian people to progress to where we are today – we are grateful for your support.

The unfortunate setbacks in Cambodia since 2017 which prompted your review, have undermined the collective progress that we have all worked towards. This is especially true for Cambodian citizens themselves who believe in liberal democracy and have expressed their democratic opinions. Significantly the Cambodian liberal minded population, are those born between the 1980s and 2000s, and who escaped the genocide, they command a majority of public opinion, owing to their access to education and open information, the improved socioeconomic situation, and human security in recent decades. Children's right to public primary education where democracy, human rights and rule-of law are taught, are essential factors to secure sustained advancement of Cambodia's liberal democracy. Climate vulnerable communities' ability to exercise their rights to protect their own ecosystems also is precondition. This not only directly sustains their natural resources dependent livelihoods and way of life, but also contributes to the fight against the effects of global climate change strongly championed by the Swedish government.

We observe that these civil rights improvements have led to a natural and committed response from communities. Therefore, the democratic setback we have been experiencing more recently means we must not be distracted but continue our resolve to carry on working effectively with these communities.

Swedish government's values-driven diplomacy stands out among the few bilateral donors who carry tremendous soft power. This is welcomed by all Cambodian stakeholders making this value-added diplomatic role more important than ever. Past experience taught us that to isolate Cambodia now could mean a repetition of past mistakes.

We urge the Swedish government to stick to their 'commitment to the global fight-against climate change and Covid-19 with human rights and democracy as key to leaving no one behind'. We sincerely hope that 'Sweden will stand up for democratic principles and support democracy in all contexts' as presented to the Riksdag Committee on Foreign Affairs in 2019 by you, Madame Minister, together with HE Minister for International Development Cooperation Peter Eriksson, and published in the Nordic Minister Op-ed on 11 September 2020.

We urge you to invest in the present embassy and Swedish Development Cooperation since Cambodia could be at another crossroad. We stress the importance of children's rights to primary education and of vulnerable groups' efforts for sustainable livelihoods that address

climate change outcomes. We believe these are fundamentally in line with Swedish government commitments and thought leadership globally.

We represent the undersigned Cambodian and Swedish civil society groups, trade unions, media, NGOs, research and policy thinktanks listed below. Many have been operating in Cambodia since the 1970s and we need to continue to work alongside local communities and civic movements.

Please don't turn your back on Cambodia's democratic and human rights development journey.
