#### Media for Peace project (MP) (BfdW)

**Objective:** The trained media experts play a pioneering role in peace-oriented and ethnical conflict reporting.

**Indicators:**

- By the end of the project, the trained media experts have produced and disseminated at least 600 peace-oriented media contents (such as articles, videos, or radio talks) posted or linked on the newly established M4P- Facebook-page.
- By the end of the project, the newly established M4P-facebook-page counts at least 10,000 subscribers.
- By the end of the project, at least 5 YouTube-tutorials (produced by the trained media experts), which outline methods and contexts of peacebuilding in social media and peace journalism in Cambodia, are accessible to the public.

- By the end of the project, newly installed conflict resolution subcommittees under the commune councils or alternative mechanisms for conflict resolutions are functioning in six out of seven target communities.
